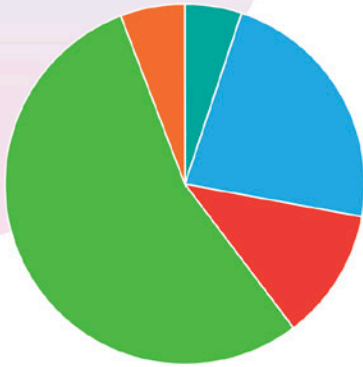

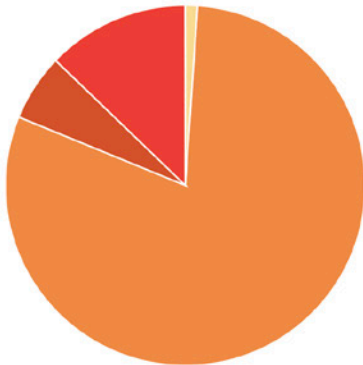
We are so grateful for our amazing volunteers and the incredible impact they have on our organization and the community. They bring happiness, improve our care and inspire compassion every day.
